

Progress:

 Graduation Rates: One of the key improvements statewide, and reflected in Schnee Learning Center's performance, has been graduation rates. The overall four-year graduation rate for Ohio increased, and Schnee Learning Center showed positive trends in this area. This aligns with the statewide push to ensure more students are prepared for postsecondary education or the workforce.

How Does Schnee Compare to the Other Dropout Recovery Program Schools in Ohio?

Schnee Combined 4,5,6,7,8 Year Graduation Rate: **60.8%**

All Dropout Recovery Program Schools Combined Graduation Rate: 45.8%

• Student Growth: The "Progress Component," which measures how well students are growing academically compared to expectations, indicates that Schnee Learning Center met growth expectations.

Challenges:

• Chronic Absenteeism: An ongoing issue is chronic absenteeism. Although it has declined slightly across the state, it remains a challenge at Schnee Learning Center, where attendance rates (63%) are still below the ideal targets for student engagement and success.

In summary, while Schnee Learning Center has made strides in areas like graduation rates and student growth, there are still challenges with academic proficiency and absenteeism that need ongoing attention to drive further improvements.
